

PE and SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING REPORT

What is the Primary School PE & Sport Premium?

For several years the government has allocated extra funding to all primary schools to improve Physical Education (PE) and Sport so that they develop pupils' healthy lifestyles.

What should it be used for?

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

How much have we received for 2016- 2017?

In 2016-2017 St Thomas More's Primary School received £9000 for the PE and Sport Premium.

How did our school spend our funding in 2016 – 2017 and what was the impact?

This table gives an indication of how the funding was spent but the total budget for sport, PE and extra-curricular activity far exceeds the premium offered.

Fund a member of staff to co-ordinate the programme of extra-curricular sports and clubs and encourage more pupils to take up sport	A survey revealed that 261 of the 315 pupils have taken part in the extra-curricular programme	£2400	On average 22 clubs are offered every week across all year groups. We gained the Gold Sport Mark Award. The responsibility for administration, communication with parents etc. gave teachers more time to commit to coaching.
Fund prizes for inter-schools sport competitions	Year 5&6, Year 2 60 pupils	£120	In our cluster, we were able to provide competition in sports that were not available through the Havant Sports Partnership
Purchase of archery equipment	Year 2,3,4,5,6 120 pupils	£415	Children gained the opportunity to participate in a sport they had never experienced before. Many went on to join a local archery club.

How much will we receive in 2017-18?

In 2017-2018 St. Thomas More's Primary School will receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil (£2700) for the PE and Sport Premium.

How will it be spent?

- Hire of sports coaches to work with teachers in PE lessons to develop their practice and help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Hire of Sports coaches to co-ordinate lunchtime sports leagues
- Fund a member of staff to co-ordinate the programme of extra-curricular sports and clubs and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- Fund prizes for inter-schools sport competitions
- Purchase of gymnastics equipment
- Fund supply cover to release the PE Co-ordinator to review the PE scheme of work
- Purchase of Fixed Outdoor Sports Equipment for break times and lunchtimes
- Pay for a swimming coach to lead swimming lessons in Year 3/4 and train teachers to be swimming instructors.
